## Hungarian Summit Education – Bridge to Hungary

Side Events at NAFSA Orlando 2026

25–30 May 2026 | Orlando, Florida, USA

This privacy notice (hereinafter: Notice) aims to inform data subjects about the processing of their personal data in connection with the **Hungarian Summit Education – Bridge to Hungary** side events organised alongside the NAFSA Annual Conference & Expo 2026 (25–30 May 2026, Orlando, Florida, USA), and about the rights and legal remedies available to them.

### 2. DESCRIPTION OF DATA PROCESSING

#### 2.1. Purpose and legal basis of processing



#	Data processing	Purpose	Legal basis
A1	<b>Participant registration and event management</b>	Management of registrations, invitations and attendance lists for all side events (25 May: exhibition opening and VIP reception; 29 May: professional mini-conference; 29 May evening: closed VIP networking event; 30 May: diaspora information event). Ensuring access control and on-site coordination.	<b>Under Article 6/1. e.) of the GDPR (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Data Controller in the field of Hungarian vocational training, education, research and development).</b> The Data Subject may object to processing on the legal basis necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by sending an e-mail to the e-mail address of the Controller as set out in point 1.
A2	<b>Communication with applicants</b>	Contacting registered participants before and after the events: sending invitations, confirmations, logistical information, programme changes and post-event follow-up materials.	
A3	<b>Photography, video recording and further use of recordings</b>	Taking photographs and video recordings at the events for documentation, reporting and promotion of the <b>Hungarian Summit Education – Bridge to Hungary</b> and TPF's internationalisation activities. Recordings may be published on TPF's websites, online platforms, social media channels and used at future TPF events.	

<b>A4</b>	<b>Enforcement of data subject rights</b>	Handling, assessing and responding to requests by data subjects exercising their rights under the GDPR.	
<b>A5</b>	<b>Legal enforcement and defence</b>	Establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims arising from or in connection with the events.	

## 2.2. Categories of data subjects

**A1; A2** – Individuals who register for or receive invitations to any of the side events; speakers, presenters and VIP guests.

**A3** – All natural persons appearing in photographs or video recordings taken at the events (participants, speakers, accompanying persons, members of the public present at public-access venues).

**A4; A5** – Natural persons involved in data subject rights requests or legal proceedings.



## 2.3. The categories of personal data processed

**A1; A2** – Full name; e-mail address; phone number; professional affiliation (institution/organisation, position, country); dietary or accessibility requirements (where voluntarily provided); attendance confirmation status.

**A3** – Likeness (photographs, video recordings) and any information directly discernible therefrom (e.g., name badge).

**A4; A5** – Identification and contact data of the person concerned; data relevant to the subject matter of the request or legal claim.

*The Data Controller does not verify the personal data provided to it. The individual providing the data is entirely responsible for its accuracy and legal compliance.*

## 3. Persons authorized to access the data



Personal data may be accessed by those employees and authorised contractors of TPF whose work requires access. All such persons have received data protection training and are bound by confidentiality obligations.

### 3.1 Transfer of personal data to a third country

**Events held in the United States.** The side events take place in Orlando, Florida, USA, which is a third country outside the European Economic Area (EEA). Personal data of registered participants will necessarily be processed in the USA in connection with on-site event management (access lists, coordination). The legal basis for this transfer is Article 46(2)(c) GDPR (standard contractual clauses) or, where applicable, the EU–US Data Privacy Framework adequacy decision (European Commission, 10 July 2023), in respect of certified US service providers engaged by TPF (e.g., event management platforms, hotel/venue systems).

**Publications on online platforms.** After publication, visitors to TPF's webpages and social media platforms (Google, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, LinkedIn, etc.) may have their data transferred outside the EEA, typically to the United States. Transfers to certified providers are based on the EU–US Data Privacy Framework; transfers to non-certified providers are based on Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs).

The Data Controller shall maintain an up-to-date record of engaged processors and sub-processors pursuant to Article 30 GDPR and shall ensure that appropriate transfer safeguards are in place prior to any transfer.

#### 4. Retention time



Data processing Retention period

**A1; A2 – Registration & communication** Until 10 years from the date of the relevant event, or until finalisation of any related legal claim, whichever is later. Annual storage review by the Data Controller.

**A3 – Photography & video** 3 years from the date of the event. After expiry, recordings will be removed from surfaces under TPF's direct control and shall no longer be used in active communications.

**Note:** TPF cannot guarantee removal from surfaces not under its direct control (e.g., content shared by third parties, internet archives).

**A4; A5 – Rights & legal** 5 years from finalisation of the request or legal proceeding.



#### 5. Automated decision-making and profiling

Neither automated decision-making nor profiling within the meaning of Article 22 GDPR occurs in the course of any of the above data processing activities.

#### 6. Rights of the Data Subject



Detailed information on the rights of the data subject can be found in Articles 12-22 of the GDPR. The data subject's right to dispose of their personal data remains valid throughout the duration of the data processing.

The data subject may exercise their rights by sending an email to the Data Protection Officer at the address provided in point 1. The data controller shall examine the request as soon as possible after its submission, but no later than within one month, decide on its merits, and inform the applicant of its decision in writing (primarily by electronic means).

**Right to information** - We provide you with clear and understandable information about the processing of your personal data in a concise, transparent, understandable, and easily accessible manner.

**Right of access** - You have the right to receive feedback on whether we process your personal data and, if so, to receive information about the details of this after identification. As a data subject, you may also request a copy of your processed personal data.

**Right to rectification** - You may request the rectification or completion of inaccurate data. If there are any modifications or changes to the data processed by the Data Controller during the data processing period, please report them immediately at the above contact details.

**Right to erasure ("right to be forgotten")** - We will erase your data if the data processing has achieved its purpose, or if you lawfully object to the processing, if the data processing is unlawful, or if the data must be erased in order to comply with a legal obligation.

**Right to restriction of processing** - You may request restriction of the processing of your data if you believe that the processing is inaccurate, unlawful, or unnecessary, or if you object to the processing. In such cases, we will only store the data until we have investigated the above suspicion.

**Right to object** - As a data subject, you have the right to object at any time to the processing of your data for the performance of tasks carried out in the public interest. The Data Controller may only continue to process the data if there are compelling legitimate grounds for doing so or for the enforcement of legal claims.

## 7. Legal Remedies:

**DPO** - The Data Subject may contact the Data Protection Officer of the Data Controller at the contact details provided in section 1 with any questions, comments or complaints regarding the processing of data. The Data Processor will provide the Data Subject with the requested information in writing, preferably by electronic means, as soon as possible, but no later than one month after receipt of the request. The procedure for the execution of reasonable requests is free of charge.

**NAIH** - Furthermore, the Data Subject may lodge a complaint with the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information (address: 1055 Budapest, Falk Miksa u. 9.-11.; 1363 Budapest, Pf. 9; [www.naih.hu](http://www.naih.hu)) regarding the processing of their data)

**Court** - A Data Subject may take legal action against the TPF if he or she considers that the TPF is processing his or her personal data in violation of the provisions on the processing of personal data laid down by law or by a binding legal act of the European Union.

## 8. Miscellaneous

8.1 TPF has implemented appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect personal data against unauthorized access, alteration, disclosure, erasure, accidental destruction or damage.

8.2 If the Data Controller intends to use personal data for purposes other than those for which they were originally collected, data subjects will be informed in advance and, where required, their consent will be obtained.

8.3 TPF reserves the right to amend this Notice unilaterally, with notification published on its website. Data subjects will be informed of material changes via the event communication channels.
